Whilst I have been preparing to write my annual report I have been reflecting on how we started, from the early days to the completion of our first project.

I think we have all had a massive learning curve, from the very early days when we decided to go it alone, that is to say without further help from consultants.

The Above Derwent Community Land Trust (ADCLT) first started as a sub-group in the Above Derwent Parish Council (ADPC). Finding a suitable site was not easy and eventually Pow Wood became available. Perhaps not the best site, given the sloping terrain. The Covid pandemic lead to supply shortages and delays in the labour market. However, towards the end of 2022 and early 2023 we finally saw all the houses occupied. It was an immensely proud moment for all the members to see the families finally settled in their new homes.

This year 2023, we were selected for an audit by Homes England. This has been submitted and we await the outcome. The hard work by certain members in completing this is very much appreciated.

A subgroup was established to identify sites in the Above Derwent Parish (ADP) however, due to the current financial situation and the difficulty in securing a site things are now on hold. The high number of holiday lets and second homes in the ADP continues to rise, exacerbating the housing situation for young families.

We are very fortunate to have within ADCLT a broad range of professional and dedicated members who continue to support and I am grateful for the time they so freely give.
